When you are discouraged by everything, I urge you to think of your discouragement as an invitation to enter into a prayerful mood. To thank God for what you have. To remember all the good times. To think of people in your circle who might need a friendly telephone call. While we can't meet together, we proclaim the "Good News" in any way we can. If we can't meet in person, we can meet over the telephone, on conference calls, and on our church's Facebook page. The coronavirus has shut many doors for us, but God has opened up many more. Because we are fast on our feet as a church, we move into new ways of doing things quickly. We are confident that God is in control, so we act with boldness (not arrogance, but boldness, there is a difference). Remember that fires and storms have knocked down our past buildings, but the true church continues without a pause. That's why Buckingham has survived 350 years. We are an adaptable, resilient, prayerful people. We don't crumble when the obstacles multiply. We meet the challenges and then we move ahead. I can't tell you how upset I get when I read in the newspaper that such-n-such church has "closed down" because of COVID19. What kind of message does that send to the community about who we are? Just because the church building is closed for public services, that does not mean the "church is closed." The church is a spiritual community that scatters during the week physically but is still united in spirit...whether or not it meets in a building. Because your Session believes that it is important that the church adapt to new circumstances in this crisis in a responsible way, they have said we are "moving online" rather than having said we are "canceling services." Saying that we are "moving online" means we are still worshipping, but not in the sanctuary or Taylor Hall. Moreover, there is no reason to stop having committee meetings, kid's events, bell ringing, or music events. All of those things can take place online now. Since we can still meet, let's do it! When the world shuts one door, God opens another.

Overcoming the Challenges of Figuring out Social Media

We are forced to move online to hold services but that does not mean it is an easy process to do so. Facebook and Zoom can be more complicated than we would want them to be. Moreover, these technologies are changing all the time which can heighten the confusion. But I want you to hang in there. Give yourself time to work out all the problems. If you are trying to use the technology for the first time, give yourself five times to figure out all those complexities. Be proactive in trying out the technology. 

They stopped their soup kitchen and are accepting no new residents at this time. We had already purchased toilet paper, paper towels, and diapers for them so, we drove down and delivered them. They were very appreciative. Worcester Youth found a way to serve and to use our funds by making 40 brown bagged lunches and delivering them to the office at The Cannery.
