# MEET OUR NEW PASTOR: WHAT ARE WE LOOKING FOR, BUCKINGHAM?

Dear Friends – What a whirlwind, but my family and I are here and settled into the beautiful manse in our equally beautiful new community of Berlin! Many thanks to all who helped prepare the way and who have also extended a warm hand of welcome so I can get my feet wet at the church and in the ocean with your many suggestions for the best beach spots! (How did you know I'd be looking for those?)

Speaking of looking, on Aug. 23, our first Sunday together, we discerned that beautiful, powerful question that Jesus asks His disciples: *What are you looking for?* 

We heard him ask this of Andrew and the "unnamed" disciple at the beginning of John's Gospel (1:38). Their answer was faith-filled: "*Rabbi, where are you staying*?" In other words, we trust you to be our Rabbi, our teacher, the One to teach and guide us in the ways of God and God's intended life for us. And while learning from you – we want to go and be where you are. We want to go and be in the places where we may find you, Lord - be they near or far. At this, Jesus invites them to "*Come and See!*"

And Jesus still invites His disciples to do the same. To learn from Him and to go and find Him. To open our lives to a different way of living – ways of mission and service, ways of mercy and compassion, ways that open our eyes to see Him everywhere He asks us to go - and in whoever we meet along the way.

What are we looking for? It's still a great question – for every disciple today and for the collective Church that gathers and worships - and then goes out to share God's love and to serve others in Christ's name. Remember the "unnamed" disciple? There is no such thing. WE are that disciple, still called to come and see and to BE wherever we may find Jesus, and the need to BE the church.

What are WE looking for, Buckingham? Are we looking for a beautiful faith community, long held together by tradition? Are we looking for new ways to reach others and to show the love of God to others? Are we looking for ONE CHURCH with many expressions of worship, praise, and prayer? Are we looking for a church where every member feels loved, respected and deeply cared for?

If these are the things we're looking for – I'd say we've come to the right place!

And maybe there's more? Maybe we're looking for studies that honor God with our whole heart, mind and strength? Charlon Moore Pruitt's mother, Irene Moore, and my mother, Dorothy Taylor, were close friends and worked tirelessly for Buckingham. In addition to church suppers there were several fundraisers known as "Tasting Teas." Volunteers made their best dishes and cards were printed with the recipe. People tasted as many dishes as they wished and bought the recipe cards of the ones they liked. Some of my best recipes came from those events. I dare not mislead you, dear reader, into thinking that I still cook; I have a charming painting of a horse hanging over my stovetop! However, my *microwave* is a cherished appliance.

I remember a bake sale when Miss Irene asked me to help price some of the items and asked me how much a dozen eggs cost. I don't think she believed me when I said I didn't have any idea (and still don't know) so she sent me on my way and recruited someone who was more helpful.

Just for fun, I'll include a recipe I purchased at a Tasting Tea. It doesn't require any cooking and when I last made it (I don't recall how many years ago) it was quite tasty. The recipe was submitted by Betty Bunting. Betty passed away not long ago and the Bunting family continues to operate the banner planes flying down the beach.

### Betty Bunting's Mandarin Orange Salad

- 11 oz can mandarin oranges (recipe doesn't say drain, but I would)
- 11 oz can drained pineapple chunks
- 1/2 cup flaked coconut
- 1/3 cup cherries
- 1 cup miniature marshmallows
- 2 bananas, sliced
- 1 cup sour cream

Mix well and refrigerate overnight.


