Pastor Notes for March 2021: Walking Through the Mess in Lent

This time of year can be a little messy, yes? Even as I write this, the ground is muddy from the abundance of rain we've had recently. There are many pools of water all around — so be careful out there! It's just a little messy right now with lots of "yuck!" everywhere. And yet, the mess can also be seen as a welcome sight knowing Spring is just around the corner.

The same thing can be said about the season of Lent (which in Old English means "spring!"). Starting on Ash Wednesday, Lent can be a bit messy. (You try making the ashes!) But that's kind of the point of Lent. Life is messy at times and never perfect. We are prone to sin. We mess up, hurting others and ourselves. Lent reminds is that we are human.

And so on Ash Wednesday we are marked with a little mess on our foreheads as a reminder of the messiness of this life. But as the season of Lent moves forward, our prayers and music, scriptures and reflections also point us to another reality: all is not lost – because of Jesus. We remember that He, God's son, became one of us and entered the mess alongside us.

We set Lent apart, then, as an intentional time – to be reminded of what Christ has done for us and give thanks. We remember that through Christ we are saved – and the mess of sin we are in – whatever it may be – is wiped clean through His love and sacrifice. Through His saving act – we are set free to fully become the human beings God made us to be – created in God's image and able to see and serve Christ in our every fellow human being.

Lent is also a great time to remember that we are not perfect – but continually being perfected. And being perfected takes practice! There is a great book called The Walk: 5 Essential Practices of the Christian Faith by Adam Hamilton. I recommend it to you as a Lenten study. The practices Hamilton suggests are: 1) Increased worship and prayer, 2) time in Bible study, 3) missional service, 4) learning to give selflessly while investing in the work of the Kingdom of Heaven, and 5) faithful sharing of the Good News of our faith with others.

Read it and ask: Do any or all of these ring true for you as areas of your life you'd like to try to practice more? Or maybe the Spirit is calling you in other ways to make this Lent a holy and less messy time. Think about it – but also remember – Lent may be a 6-week season – but our walk with Jesus is for a lifetime.

I look forward to walking every step in the mess of Lent with you. Pastor Mark

A Note from Historian Lynne Murray

Dear BPC Friends,

I think you will forgive me for again posting my Gram article from October 2020 about my friend Madeline Moore. When I received Pastor Mark's email informing us of her passing on February 7, I was truly saddened. Many of you will recall Madeline's many years as a choir member and although I participated for a number of years, she served for more than 50 years. I spoke with Madeline in September before writing the article and she was in good spirits and we humorously reminisced about our ill-fated trip to camp. I remember her fondly and wish to again share with you one of my most special memories of Madeline.

Many of you know Madeline West Moore. Madeline is a lovely lady and has been one of the most dedicated people to Buckingham that I can recall. She and husband Fred live behind the church on Grace Street in the house she shared with her older sister Olive West. Olive and Madeline were two of fourteen children, 9 girls and 5 boys. Madeline's only remaining sibling passed away just last month. Olive was thirty years older than Madeline and the two shared a very special relationship as Olive also adopted Madeline as her own child. I remember Olive quite clearly, she was always beautifully dressed and groomed, and of course in those days wore a hat to church!

No event at BPC was conducted without the help of the West ladies. You knew they could be depended upon to work at gatherings of any kind, be it a church event or a fundraiser. Madeline kept up that work long after Olive's passing, until she has regretfully found health issues have curtailed her physical involvement. Madeline is the proud possessor of a 50 year pin for singing in the choir, an activity that she kept up for years after receiving the award. She also directed the Youth Choir for many years.

My most special memory of Madeline was our ill-fated trip to camp at Massanetta, Virginia. Reverend Strome had come here from New Jersey and his former church always sponsored a retreat at Massanetta, so he arranged for our youth to attend camp when the New Jersey people were there. My mother volunteered to drive some kids to the camp so Madeline and I were in her car. By the time we got to the Shenandoah Valley I felt like we had driven from the West Coast. Things didn't get any better after we got there. We only had a snack on the road instead of stopping for a lengthy lunch, but there was no place to get anything to eat until the dining room opened for dinner. The New Jersey people weren't very friendly, and by my regular bedtime I was beginning to focus on mother's leaving without me the next day. We were then informed to stay up and meet with our counselor at 11 pm. I was exhausted, and that's about the time this odd tightness started in my throat. By morning the tightness had dissolved into tears and I blubbered to Mother that I was going home with her.

Then I scouted the Buckingham troupe to see who I could talk into going back home with me so I wouldn't look like the only misfit. I was disgusted with Carol Cathell and Kay Harrison for deciding to stay, but to Madeline's everlasting credit she was as eager to get back to Berlin as I was! I don't think we ever see each other to this day that we don't laugh about our experience, or lack thereof, at camp!

Madeline W. Moore, age 82, of Berlin died Sunday, February 7, 2021 at home. Madeline was born in Salisbury and was the daughter of the late James Edward and Olive Mae (Quillen) West. She retired from Merial Select Laboratory in Berlin as a lab technician. Madeline was a member of Buckingham Presbyterian Church where she had served as an Elder, Deacon, Sunday School Teacher, and sang in the Choir for over 50 years.

Don't panic - just take a moment to breathe - you're not alone.


Who are the angels whom God has sent to be by your side? A friend? A family member? A neighbor?
