PASTOR NOTES for DECEMBER 2021: SINGING THE SEASONS!

Christmas is all around us and it's beautiful to see. The lights are going up on the houses, on the streetlights and on the trees. Christmas Cookie baking contests and holiday specials are coming at us non-stop through the T.V. And the radio stations are playing Christmas carols at full speed.

Indeed, Christmas is all around us in all we taste and hear and see. And that's a good thing - because Christmas is a warm and wonderful and nostalgic time. (Not to mention tasty, too!) There is much to be enjoyed - much that is only enjoyed - at

Christmas time.



As Christians, though, we know there is much more to Christmas. We know that it is - first and foremost about the birth of Jesus, God's son, Emmanual, God-with-Us. We know that the season exists to celebrate and honor Him. We know that Christmas can also be a time to open our lives to "prepare Him room" and welcome all that He brings as God's gift to humanity and hope for the Kingdom of Heaven to come.

To remember the deeper meaning of Christmas, and to allow it to deepen our lives in faith, we know

that we need a Holy Advent.

The Season of Advent is the four weeks prior to Christmas Eve. Advent means "coming" or "arrival." During these weeks, we anticipate the celebration of Jesus's coming to be with us - first at his birth, and again sometime in the future. We mark this journey through advent with the weekly lighting of the Advent candles - representing the themes of Hope, Peace, Joy and Love - all things that Jesus brings into our lives.

What we don't do much of in Advent, though, is sing all-out Christmas carols! (Not in church, anyway.) Our songs are more about waiting, hoping, longing, praying ... for the day of Jesus's return. Advent songs are meant more to draw us closer to Him and celebrate His birth - our faith in which

remains with us until His return.

Advent songs are just as beautiful as our favorite carols. Of course, to appreciate the beauty in anything, one must slow down and really take it all in. This Advent we will do just that - slow down over one song in-particular each week. One song that speaks of the gifts of hope, peace, joy and love given to us in Jesus. I hope in the end, we'll all be more ready to sing loud and proud with the Angels proclaiming His birth in Bethlehem on Christmas Evel

I look forward to singing the season of Advent with all of you!

I also want to say that Advent is a great time of year for re-committing to your spiritual walk. If you've been away from church for a while, it's a great time to come back and be welcomed home by your church which misses

In this season of recommitment - let's be led by the lights of Advent. May they lead us forward as a church - together - led by our Savior Jesus

Christ.

We are finding more information out about possibly renting the Flagship Theater for December 26th for anyone who would like to go see the Grinch together as a church.

A Note from Historian Lynne Murray


In Defense of a Manger



A manger is defined as a container for grain or a rack for fodder. These objects haven't changed since ancient times and are standard equipment in barns today. I believe the Bethlehem innkeeper who offered his barn to Joseph and the expectant Mary knew his premises to be acceptable for the anxious couple. Animals were expensive possessions and it behooved him to house and care for them properly. No doubt he provided his domesticated beasts with a reasonably clean food container and fresh hay. I feel a kinship to this long-ago livestock owner; my barn was cleaned and swept at least twice a day and if time allowed I brushed the horses daily. In the summer my daughter's mare, Holly Golightly, was bathed and braided the night before a weekly horse show.

I particularly cherish the memory of the barn on Christmas Eve. As usual, I wiped out each feed tub and automatic waterer before dumping their grain and filling the hay racks. Then I went home to my own dinner and dressed for our Candlelight Service. I always stopped by the barn on my way home from church to feel the most profound peace I've ever experienced. The smell of timothy hay and fresh wood shavings in the stalls permeated the air, and the sounds of contented munching made me feel as though this was truly Peace On Earth. All three of our horses have passed on now, but if I close my eyes I can imagine the peace and comfort an ancient innkeeper provided for a Nazarene carpenter and his wife.

A photo of my daughter Teresa riding Holly side-saddle shows them waiting to join the 1984 American Legion parade in Ocean City. Teresa was dressed as Betsy Ross and is pictured behind the former Misty Harbor Motel, owned by my sister and brother-in-law, Susan and Hugh Cropper III. At the parade, a friend said they couldn't believe a horse that clean ever lived in a barn! A better photo, without Holly's nose cropped, was taken at the Washington International Horse Show Ladies' Side-Saddle Class. Before Holly came into our lives, BPC member Susan Jackson Todd was Teresa's very first riding instructor. Susan's photo shows her giving a bottle to Holly's foal; the mare had no milk and "Velvet Golightly" contracted pneumonia when just a few days old. To survive, the veterinarian advised Velvet must be kept in an incubator-like atmosphere, so he stayed in our kitchen for a week. But that's a story for another time . . .
