- 1) What is the purpose of the "Church?"
- 2) "How is the Church meaningful in your life?
- 3) How does Buckingham ascent to new heights for Jesus Christ?
- 4) How do we—with faith, hope and courage—invite others to join in the active work of the Holy Spirit?

- 1. What We Talk About When We Talk About God, Rob Bell, 2013. Rob Bell is known for his sometimes controversial and always engaging take on theology and spirituality. His latest book helps diffuse the tension between the faith-minded and the science-minded. A good read; poetic and challenging. (For another great Bell book, consider: Everything is Spiritual.)
- 2. N.T. Wright's <u>Everyone New Testament Commentary Series</u>, N.T. Write, 2003-2004. Write's popular commentary series is called "Everyone" for a reason it's written in a way that everyone can understand, breaking out the Scriptures and providing good, thought-provoking and faith-enhancing discussion. It makes for a terrific devotional too.
- 3. **The Shack**, Wm. Paul Young, 2007. Considered by many to be one of the most powerful evangelical writings of the 21st Century, The Shack takes the reader on journey of faith, forgiveness, reconciliation and redemption. This was one of those books I'd heard about for several years, but never found the time or interest to read it until it literally jumped off the shelf at me. It makes a powerful impact and really does change one's perspective on many things.
- 4. <u>The Armchair Theologians Series</u> Do have an interest in theology but find reading Calvin's Institutes a tad cumbersome? Um, yeah, me too. But this series actually makes theology fun with humor, insight, and graphics that helps one make sense out of complicated and heavy-duty material. Start with John Calvin or Martin Luther or Augustine. There are 13 in total, and more on the way, I think.
- <u>5. Proof of Heaven</u>, Eben Alexander, M.D., 2012. By far the best and most compelling/convincing book I've read on "near death experiences" written out of the experience of a neuroscientist who, up until his own NDE, was a non-believer in the afterlife and convinced that all things we all in one's head.
- 6. **The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe,** CS Lewis. Alright, it's a classic but I find myself drawn back to this story over and over. Whether you read it as a kid, or never at all it's a wonderful tale of mystery and mysticism and faith grounded in "the Lion." While you're at it, read the whole Narnia series. (Some are better than others; my other favorites are: <a href="Prince Caspian">Prince Caspian</a>, Voyage of the Dawn Treader, and The Magician's Nephew.)
- 7. One Thousand Gifts: A Dare to Live Fully Right Where You Are, Ann Voskamp Aimee read this one and was captivated by its mystical, lyrical take on faith and gratitude. I paged through it and found it intriguing as well. It is definitely not for everyone's tastes but it is a powerful book that draws its readers closer to the love and majesty of our Creator.
- 8. <u>The Solace of Leaving Early</u>, Haven Kimmel Another of Aimee's recent favorites, Kimmel uses small-town life as a springboard to explore the loftiest of ideas. The book is "at once a romance and a haunting meditation on grief and faith" and "a joyous story about finding one's better self through accepting the shortcomings of others.
- 9. **The Road**, Cormack McCarthy This is one of my favorite books. It is a gripping story, told in a very minimalistic style, of a father and son's quest for survival after an earth-shattering event. It can be quite rough and some of the subject matter (e.g. cannibalism) may not for a sweet summer reading make for everyone but at its heart is a deep theology and faith in humanity and in the "Fire" that cannot be extinguished even by the darkest of darkness.
- 10. <u>A Prayer for Owen Meany</u>, John Irving The opening line reads: "I am doomed to remember a boy with a wrecked voice—not because of his voice, or because he was the smallest person I ever knew, or even because he was the instrument of my mother's death, but because he is the reason I believe in God; I am a Christian because of Owen Meany." Need I say more to intrigue you?
