PASTOR NOTES: FEED THE CHILDREN WELL

"Jesus said: 'Let the little children come to me; do not stop them; for it is to such as these that the kingdom of God belongs." - Mark: 10:14

One of the things that drew me to Buckingham from the get-go was our commitment to our children and youth. From Sunday children's messages to S'more Time with Jesus events to our outreach to tweens and teens, we are a church that takes seriously our call to help young people get to know Jesus and grow in their faith in Him.



In order to do so, though, we need all hands on deck! All church members with a heart for children and youth are encouraged to step up and get involved. Here's a run-down of the MANY opportunities we all have to help the children come to the Lord:

Sunday AM "Sheep Pen" Children's Feeding Time - Every Sunday we have fun feeding our little sheep while making a joyful noise with song and cereal! Messages based on the week's scripture readings are re-emphasized with fun games and crafts. HELP NEEDED: Adults leaders to be on deck to help organize the craft and snack time at both services.

S'more Time with Jesus - Our (almost) bi-weekly children and family fun nights on the front lawn. The schedule for planned activities through May can be found in the Gram and on the church's information tables - and there's more to come! S'more Time events are for everyone! HELP NEEDED: Adult leaders to help set up/tear down events, crafts and snacks, ideas for events and folks to spread the word!

NEW - Older Elementary/Middle School Group - Beginning Sundays in May, we will have special opportunities for our older children grades 3-6 - an important time in faith development. It is also our great hope that a middle-school group will come out of this group as they move up. HELP NEEDED: Adult leaders to help with programs, ideas for events, transportation/chaperones for trips and more.

TEEN YOUTH GROUP - We have an enthusiastic group of teens who are meeting regularly Wednesday nights for food, fellowship, and learning to lean on Jesus and each other. Plans for special trips are underway, including Shad Landing. HELP NEEDED: Adult leaders to act as mentors, help with ideas for events, transportation/chaperones for trips, food and beverages and more.

If you are interested in any of these opportunities to help our youth of all ages to grow in faith – please let me, Lindsay Ashton, Jerry Woroniecki, Emily David or any member of the Christian Education committee know.

A Note from Historian Lynne Murray



"Mr. and Mrs. Henry Ernest Onley request the honour of your presence at the marriage of their daughter Mary Ruth to Sergeant Wilson Davis Warren April 28 nineteen hundred and forty-five at half after two o'clock Buckingham Presbyterian Church Berlin, Maryland." The wedding had been delayed for two and a half years. In 1943, Mary Ruth Onley and her mother made the bride's gown and the maid of honor's gown. Wilson had come home on leave to get married, but because of a series of military foul-ups, he had to go back before the wedding could take place. He was in France when the brass asked him if he wanted leave in Paris or did he want to go home. Guess which he chose? Wilson and Mary Ruth are still happily married with three children, five grandchildren, and three great-grandchildren. The members of the wedding party from left to right are Paul Scott, Casher Hickman, Evelyn Hudson Bunting, Mary Ruth, Wilson, and John Ayres. The star-studded banner in the back of the chancel recognizes the men and women from Buckingham Church who served in the war. A gold star indicates that one of the members, Louis Jones, gave his life for his country. (Warren Collection.)

Wilson and Mary Ruth [Onley] Warren were active church members until their passing some years ago. They are the parents of our Evelyn Warren and her siblings Dot and Richard. In their lovely wedding photo our pulpit chairs and hymnal board are easily identified. The Warrens had close ties to my family as Evelyn's parents lived down the street and Wilson worked for my father. Mrs. Onley was a gifted seamstress and made many garments for myself, mother Dorothy, and sister Susan.

Wilson was a very special person to me. He worked for my father, Jesse Taylor, in his Chevrolet, Oldsmobile, GMC dealership [before Gil Barrett's ownership] and was in charge of the Parts Department. My mother often said that Wilson was the best parts man; he knew what he had, where it was, and if he didn't have it he knew where to find it. Wilson worked for my father when he was released from the service, and I'm told that he used to baby-sit for me! Wilson called me "Linder Bear," all his life and I still miss him today.
